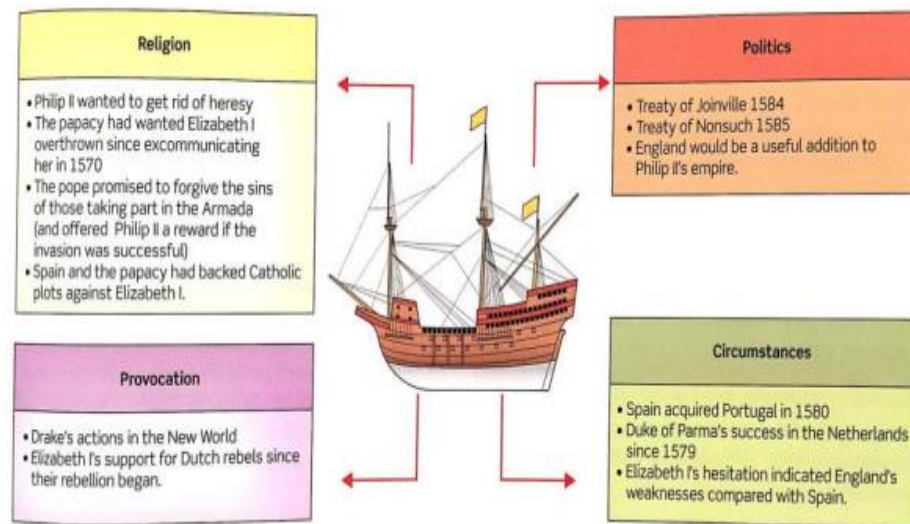

Causes of the Spanish Armada



Tudor Monarchs- date of reign, picture and biography.

Henry VII 1485-1509		Henry VII was the first monarch, after winning the Battle of Bosworth Field. He married Elizabeth of York to end the War. He made England rich during his reign.
Henry VIII 1509- 1547		Henry VIII was famous for having six wives (including having two of them executed) and brining England away from the Catholic chrich. He formed the Church of England
Edward VI 1547-1553		Edward VI came to the throne at only 9 years old. Therefore the country was run by his protectors. He was only 15 when he died and he made the England even more Protestant than his Dad.
Mary I 1553-1558		Mary I was Henry's eldest daughter. She aggressively tried to make England a Catholic Country again, She burned those who were against her earning herself the nickname, 'Bloody Mary;.
Elizabeth I 1558-1603		Elizabeth turned the country back to protestant again but wanted to create more of a fair balance between both religions. She had a long and successful reign, often known as the Golden Age. She defeated the Spanish Armada a in 1588.

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Catholics had highlight decorated churches including stain glass window and statues. Catholic Priests wore high decorated vestments with lots of gold and colorful silk. The Bible and all religious services were in Latin so the only way most people could understand was through the Priest. There were many saints in the Catholic religion which had a number of special religious days to celebrate them. In the Catholic religion you could pay an indulgence to the church to be forgiven for your sins. This meant that rich people could be forgiven but poor people could not. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Protestants had plain and simple churches as they believed there should be no distraction from God. Protestant Priests wore very plain vestments and simple wooden crosses. The Bible and religious services were in English so that everybody could undertand the wordsof God not just the Preist. Protestant did not celebrate Saints Days and limited religious celebrations just to Easter, Christmas, Marriages, Christenings and Funerals. In the Protestant religion you could not pay for indulgences as they believed that the only way to get to heaven was to be a good person and not break the 10 commandments.
